In accordance with Standing Orders 3e, 3f and 3g, Amada Taylor addressed the Committee speaking 'against' application 23/1578/TC – 99 Botany Road, Broadstairs CT10 3SB

The Committee unanimously recommends REFUSAL and reiterates their previous comments: The Committee unanimously recommends REFUSAL on the grounds of the proposed development being overbearing, out of keeping and of detrimental effect to the street scene, with loss of privacy and overshadowing of the neighbouring properties. The proposed development goes against the Broadstairs & St Peter's Neighbourhood Development Plan Policy BSP9 – Design in Broadstairs & St Peter's.

The Committee does not feel that the amended plans alleviate any of the previous issues highlighted within the objections.

In accordance with Standing Orders 3e, 3f and 3g, William Clark Smith addressed the Committee speaking 'against' application 24/0563/GD – 30 North Foreland Road, Broadstairs CT10 3NN

The Committee unanimously recommends REFUSAL on the grounds that there is no Conservation Officer's report. The proposed application goes against the Broadstairs & St Peter's Neighbourhood Plan Policies BSP7 – Areas of High Townscape Value and BSP9 – Design in Broadstairs & St Peter's. There are also concerns regarding increased on street parking in relation to the chicane at this point of the highway with lack of space and visibility issues.

309 WORKS TO TREES IN CONSERVATION AREAS/TREE PRESERVATION ORDERS/ HEDGEROW REMOVAL APPLICATIONS

RECEIVED the emailed report from the Volunteer Tree Warden.

RESOLVED that the applications be dealt with as detailed below:

(i) The Committee recommends **REFUSAL** to the applications listed below:

TPO/24/0533/MM 9 Dane Court Gardens, Broadstairs CT10 2SB

The Committee unanimously recommends REFUSAL as there is insufficient evidence of weakness to justify felling a healthy tree.

TPO/24/0266/MM 18 Radley Close, Broadstairs CT10 1BT

The Committee unanimously recommends REFUSAL as per the Tree Officer's report: The reasons provided in support of the application do

not justify the proposed felling.

TPO/24/0670/MM 2 Park Chase, Broadstairs CT10 2YW

The Committee unanimously recommends REFUSAL. We ask that the TDC Tree Officer provides guidance as to the best option to protect this tree. We consider that options 1 or 2 would be least damaging to the tree. Option 3, as suggested in the application, is not

in the best interest of the tree.

The Town Council would also like to see TDC use a local Tree Officer, as opposed to the use of a contractor based in Devon.

(ii) RESOLVED unanimously that the standard response should be sent into all other tree applications on the weekly lists (standard response and applications set out below):

The Planning Committee of the Town Council has considered the applications below and resolved unanimously that the application be subject to inspection by the TDC Biodiversity and Horticulture Officer (Tree Officer).

The Planning Committee request that the stance and recommendations in the TDC Biodiversity and Horticulture Officer report are taken into consideration when deciding applications for tree works and any suggested conditions are clearly stated to the applicant in the consent letter.

The Town Council policy for work on trees is as follows and we would respectfully ask that our recommendations are provided to the tree owner with any permission granted:

- Healthy trees are retained wherever possible.

- Only diseased or dying trees to be felled and only subject to a suitable replacement being planted. Where trees are being felled because of overcrowding, thinning rather than removal of all trees should be considered wherever possible.
- Remedial tree works i.e. Crown lift / Crown thin / Height reduction etc., to be kept to a maximum of 20% and expressed as such in the application.
- Works required for structural reasons i.e. impact of root damage to foundations and drains must be supported by recognized structural engineering evidence as well as a report from the TDC Biodiversity and Horticulture Officer.
- It is a criminal offence under the Wildlife and Countryside Act to disturb nesting birds. However, birds can roost in any month of the year. We require the applicant to check for nesting or roosting birds before undertaking works to trees and if birds are found to be nesting, for works to be postponed until nesting is complete. If birds present on the site are of high conservation concern ('red list'* or 'amber list' birds**), permission for the works should be refused unless there are overwhelming reasons for it to be given.
- No tree works should be permitted to take place during the main nesting period from mid-March until the end of August. Birds can nest or roost in any month of the year.
