Hugin

The Danish Viking Ship "Hugin" was built in commemoration of the original Jute and Anglo-Saxon invasion in the year AD 449 at Ebbsfleet. Sailing from Denmark to Viking Bay (then named Main Bay) in Broadstairs, The Hugin arrived ashore at 2:15 pm on the 28th of July 1949.

To welcome The Hugin was an estimated crowd of 30,000 people. Among many official guests waiting to greet the Viking invaders was Prince George of Denmark and the Archbishop of Canterbury.
